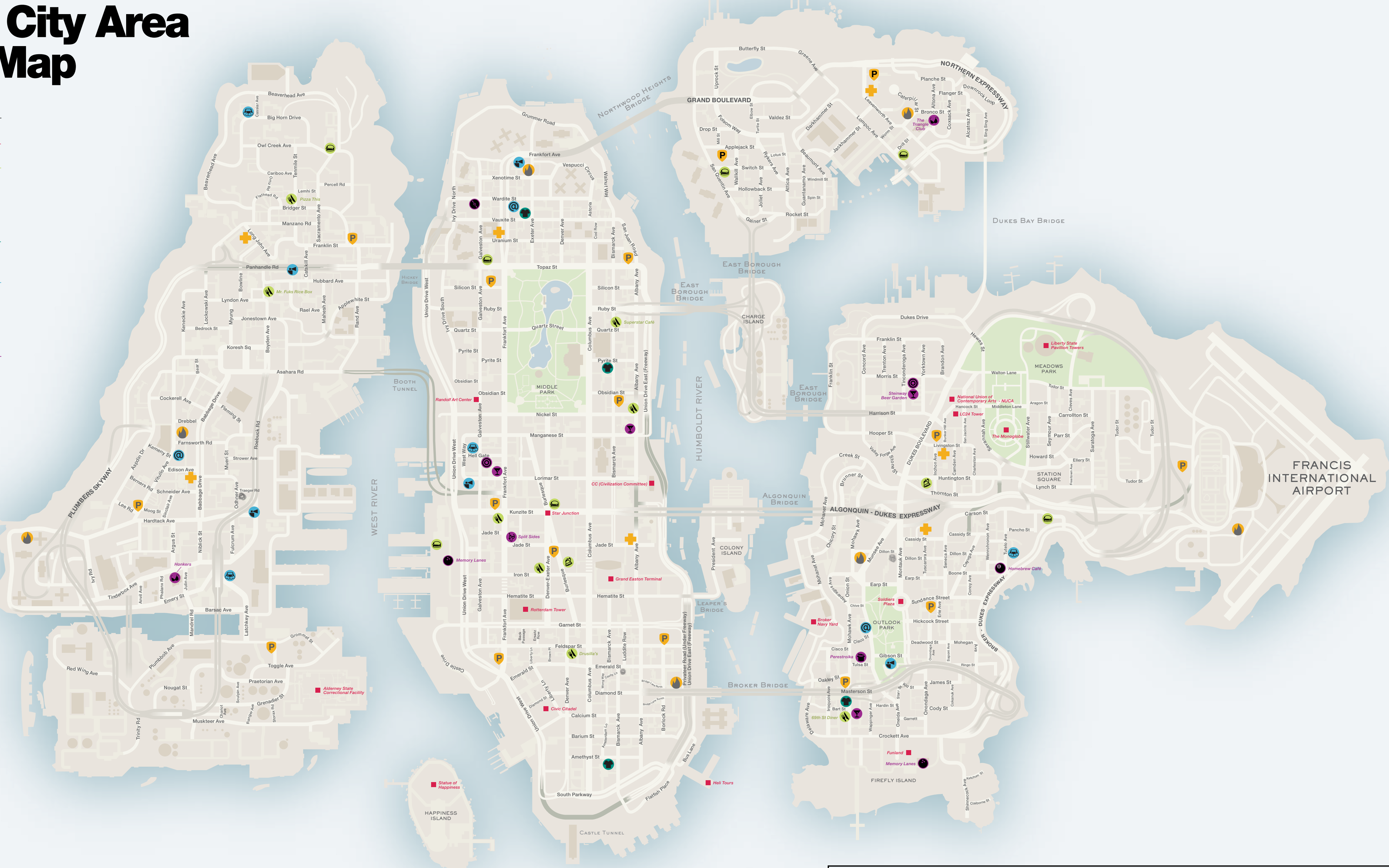

Liberty City Sights



Algonquin

Situated between the West River and the Humboldt River, Algonquin is the beating heart of Liberty City. Catch a breathtaking view of the Statue of Happiness from the Castle Gardens esplanade. Stop off in Little Italy for a dish of lukewarm Spaghetti Bolognese straight out of a jar or if counterfeit goods and suspiciously cheap food are more your thing, nearby Chinatown is also worth a visit. Max your credit card in Suffolk's trendy shopping district before heading up to the viewing platform at the top of Liberty City's tallest building,



the Rotterdam Tower. Line up with thousands of other out-of-towners getting gyped with over-priced tickets to shows in Star Junction or take a stroll through Middle Park, Algonquin's famous urban oasis. Finish off your day with some live stand-up comedy at Split Sides or black out on cocktails in Lancaster's Superstar Café.

Broker

People are beginning to discover that there is a wealth of culture to be experienced on the east side of the Humboldt River. With its brownstones and tree-lined streets, Broker offers some welcome



respite from the chaotic pace of life in Algonquin. On a nice summer's day nothing beats a stroll through Outlook Park or a hotdog on Firefly Island's famous boardwalk. Although the heyday of this amusement park has come and gone, there is still a lot to see and do, like bowling a frame or two at Memory Lanes. Hove Beach's bustling Eastern European neighborhood has an atmosphere and personality all of its own. Some Russian hospitality at Comrades Bar and a few vodkas will soon separate the men from the boys. Perestroika, the legendary supper club and local landmark, stages daily cabaret acts ranging from the weird to the wacky to the downright surreal.

Dukes

If you are arriving by plane, your first steps on Liberty City turf will probably be in Dukes. Francis International Airport sprawls across the eastern tip of the borough and serves as an international hub for the rest of the country. Dukes should be experienced first-hand rather than from a cab window as you race to catch your flight home. One of the newer attractions is the National Union of Contemporary Arts (NUCA), a museum of modern art crammed full of canvases with squiggly lines



and random objects on podiums. To the east of NUCA lies Meadows Park where you will find relics like the Monoglobe and Liberty State Pavilion Tower leftover from a world fair a half a century ago. If you are comfortable with drunken men throwing lethal weapons around a crowded bar, finish your day with a game of darts and a few beers at the famous Steinway Beer Garden.

Bohan

The Bohan people are some of the friendliest in Liberty City, especially the girls in scuffed stilettoes on the street corners at Chase Point. Show a lack of respect, however, and your next stop will be the Bohan Medical & Dental Center. Also please bear in mind that every neighborhood in Bohan believes that it invented hip-hop so, in the interest of self-preservation, please try to humor the locals. Welham Parkway in Boulevard is a beautiful spot to escape the hustle and bustle of the city for a few hours. Down a six-pack of Logger, take out some rollerbladers and go



swimming in the lake. At the tip of Northern Gardens lies one of the most tranquil and picturesque shorelines in the whole of Liberty City with hardly a hypodermic needle in sight.

Beyond Liberty City

Alderney

It is not all women with big hair and men with tight t-shirts and it is not just a place where people from Algonquin go to dump their trash. Alderney is also home to beautiful beaches, self-service gas stations, superhighways, heavy industry, palpable suburban angst and diners where the coffee is stronger than speed. Visit the Alderney State Correctional Facility on the east side of Acter Industrial Park for spectacular views of Algonquin's iconic skyline and a glimpse of what could happen to you if you carry on fiddling your tax returns. Take a walk along Alderney's idyllic western shoreline or explore the deserted casino at the northern tip of Westdyke. Discover parts of animals you never thought existed with a dinner at Mr. Fuks Rice Box in Alderney City's Korea Town and then blow the rest of your children's college fund on a private room at Honkers in Tudor.
